Principal's Report



I am delighted to provide all parents with an insight into your school photos for 2025. Dorrigo Photography are hoping to have photos ready for all families prior to the end of term. Our photo day aligned with one of the few bright sunny days this term, as such some of our photos feature a sunlit squint.

As Term 1 draws to a close, I have been impressed by our

students' motivation and enthusiasm for learning. We are busy preparing for the Armidale Eisteddfod, which will be held on Thursday, 22 May at Lazenby Hall, University of New England. Since commencing our New England Conservatorium of Music (NECOM) music program in 2023, our students have demonstrated amazing growth in their singing abilities and are to be congratulated on their outstanding achievements! Particularly when we are completing our lessons via Zoom, a vastly different platform from face-to-face music lessons. I am very proud of Hernani's singing stars and look forward to our parents and wider community joining us for the Armidale Eisteddfod.

Term 2 will commence for students on Wednesday, 30 April. Our first excursion for Term 2 will be for our PSSA age students (8 Years and above), who will be competing at the Bellinger/Nambucca District

Cross Country Carnival at Urunga on the very first Friday of Term 2. At school, we have attempted to commence fitness training in preparation for this event, however, given recent weather, this has been a challenge. I encourage all families who have students planning to attend the Cross Country to ensure that some time is spent on running a 2 to 3 km race.

I apologise for the changed dates in relation to the Finlayson Sports. I know that parents utilise our School Bytes calendar to plan and juggle both work and school events, however, this week we identified a potential clash between the Eisteddfod and the Finlayson Sports. As soon as this was realised, we contacted Chandler Public School. Finlayson Sports is now on Wednesday, 14 May, and The Armidale Eisteddfod is on Thursday, 22 May.

In Term 2, I will be taking a block of long service leave. Hernani Public School had a wonderful, serendipitous visit today from two travellers, Yusuke and Nico, who were passing through and thrilled to find a town named Hernani on the map. Nico explained to delighted students and staff that Hernani was a town very close to where he grew up and still lives in the Basque region on the Atlantic coast of Spain. He was also very interested to hear about the history of (our) Hernani's naming by Edward Parke, a veteran of the Carlist Wars in Spain in the nineteenth century, who named (our) Hernani for its resemblance to the original Hernani – a resemblance confirmed by Nico.



Never one to miss an opportunity to draw on expertise, Mrs Winkel invited Nico to talk to (our) Hernani students about (his) Hernani, Basque culture, and the unique Basque language. Students were even treated to a traditional Basque song, and were hugely impressed with Nico's talent for whistling! Students and staff were delighted to meet Nico and Yusuke, hope to learn more about Spanish Hernani and Basque culture and language, and keep in touch with our foreign correspondents. Visitor sign-in procedures for schools

All visitors attending a school site must comply with school sign-in arrangements and check in using School Visitor Check-in.

Your School Visitor Check-in QR code replaces your school's sign-in procedure for visitors and contractors.

All visitors (parents/carers, volunteers and contractors including cleaners) must use School Visitor Check-in to comply with school sign-in procedures.

Visitors, contractors and service providers on-site should use the School Visitor Check-in OR code:

- during school hours
- outside of school hours if on-site for school-related reasons (such as P&C meetings, workers such as cleaning and teachers visiting classrooms on weekends).

Visitors to the school who do not have access to electronic devices can:

- use the webform on a school device at front reception
- use the School Visitor Check-in concierge device

When School Visitor Check-in is not used

Signing in via SVCI is not required for:

- community users of school facilities for non-school-related reasons.
- schools on sites that are not operated by DoE and have existing visitor sign-in processes such as schools in a hospital or Youth Justice Centres.
- anyone on-site outside of school hours for non-school-related reasons including:
 - o outside of hours school care (OOHSC)
 - o preschools
 - o community use of school facilities and leases:
 - playgroups
 - sports clubs
 - markets
 - elections

Math Moments in Kindergarten

Over the past few weeks, our Kindergarten mathematicians have been busy building their number sense! They have been learning to count to 20 and practicing writing their numbers. They've also been exploring patterns and beginning to combine and separate groups of objects.

One of the big focuses has been taking away, using our special success criteria:

- Start with a group "How many do I have?"
- **▼** Take some away.
- **☒** Count what's left.
- Say the last number—that's how many are left!

We've also been working on combining small groups, using steps to help us:

- ☑ Count the objects in the first group.
- **☑** Count the objects in the second group.
- **■** Put them together.
- Say the last number—that's the total!

The kindergarteners are loving these hands-on activities, and Miss Curr is so proud of how quickly they are picking up new skills!







Stage 1 Mathematicians in Action!

Stage 1 students have been working hard to understand equal groups as a foundation for multiplication. They've been learning that multiplication can be solved by making equal groups. Our success criteria guides them through the process:

- First number How many groups do we need? Make the groups.
- Second number How many in each group? Match the groups __ by __.
- Count to check Are all groups equal?
- Write the answer How many altogether?

Students have been using counters and other materials to visualise these concepts. Check out our photos of their fantastic work!

In addition, we've been investigating polygons by commence at 5.30am at the Dorrigo Monument." identifying their key features:

- 1⊠ Count the sides.
- 2**■** Count the vertices (corners).
- 3**■** Name the polygon!

It has been amazing to see students apply their learning and confidently name different shapes. Keep up the fantastic work stage 1!

We can't wait to see all the amazing creations!






